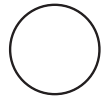

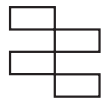
ArtPrize Categories



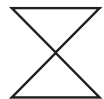
2D - Entries that exist primarily on a flat plane. Painting, drawing, photography, and most textiles are examples of 2D.



3D - Entries that occupy space and are intended to be viewed from multiple angles. Sculptures that are not site-specific are examples of 3D.



Digital - Entries that can be displayed electronically through a screen such as TVs, tablets, projectors, and the like.



Time-Based - Entries that are durational and change over time. This includes performance, video and film, dance, and interactive work.



Installation - Entries that are dependent on the site in which they are installed. The location makes up an important part of the work. Installation is different from 3D in that changing the location of the piece would dramatically change the work.

Public Vote Awards

Help decide the winners of the \$175,000 in publicly awarded prize money by voting for your favorite ArtPrize entries.

To register, you must be within the ArtPrize district boundaries (at least once!) from Sept 14–Sept 28. Scan the QR code (found on the artist label) for an entry to start the registration process, or visit <https://experience.artprize.org>.

Voting requires a mobile device. To vote, scan the QR code or enter the 5-digit Artist ID for an entry. You can register as early as Sept 7, 2023, but votes don't count until the event starts on Sept 14 at 5pm.

Vote for all entries during Round 1 to help decide the Top 25 Public Vote finalists. In Round 2, you'll vote again to choose the winners from among this group. The highest amount of votes wins the \$125,000 Grand Prize. 2nd Place wins \$50,000, and 3rd Place wins \$25,000.

Award Structure

ArtPrize remains an open international art competition decided by public vote and expert jury. This year a grand total of

\$400,000 will be distributed.

Jurors, who are selected based on their expertise and experience, will award \$125,000 worth of prizes to 10 different artists. Each entry category: 2D, 3D, Installation, Time-Based, and Digital will have a dedicated juror who will view all entries within that category and select a \$20,000 winner and a \$5,000 runner-up.

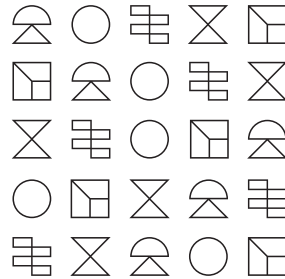
